CURRENT FIRE WEATHER FOR LAS VEGAS, PHOENIX, FLAGSTAFF, AND TUCSON

LAS VEGAS WEATHER DISCUSSION

SYNOPSIS...TEMPERATURES WILL RISE TO DANGEROUSLY HOT LEVELS THROUGH MID-WEEK AS HIGH PRESSURE STAYS ANCHORED OVER THE GREAT BASIN. ANOTHER SURGE OF MONSOON MOISTURE WILL BRING A SLIGHT CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS TO MOST AREAS BY THURSDAY...CONTINUING INTO THE WEEKEND MAINLY FOR AREAS NEAR AND EAST OF LAS VEGAS.

FLAGSTAFF WEATHER DISCUSSION

SYNOPSIS...HIGH PRESSURE WILL REMAIN CENTERED OVER SOUTHERN UTAH THROUGH TUESDAY. LOOK FOR SCATTERED AFTERNOON AND EVENING THUNDERSTORMS OVER THE HIGHER TERRAIN FROM THE MOGOLLON RIM EASTWARD AND ISOLATED STORMS ELSEWHERE. ON WEDNESDAY...DEEPER EASTERLY FLOW SHOULD BRING ADDITIONAL MOISTURE TO THE AREA AND THUNDERSTORM CHANCES WILL INCREASE ACROSS THE NORTHLAND THROUGH THE END OF THE WEEK.

PHOENIX WEATHER DISCUSSION

HIGH PRESSURE WILL REMAIN IN PLACE ACROSS THE REGION THROUGH THE WEEK...ALLOWING HOT TEMPERATURES TO PERSIST THROUGH WEDNESDAY NIGHT. THERE WILL BE AN INCREASING CHANCE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS FROM WEDNESDAY ONWARD AS MOISTURE RETURNS TO THE AREA.

TUCSON WEATHER DISCUSSION

SYNOPSIS...THERE IS A CHANCE OF MAINLY AFTERNOON AND EVENING SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS THIS WEEK. EXPECT GOOD RELATIVE HUMIDITY RECOVERIES DURING THE OVERNIGHT HOURS. STRONG...ERRATIC AND GUSTY WINDS WILL OCCUR WITH THE STRONGEST THUNDERSTORMS. OTHERWISE... EXPECT NORMAL DIURNAL WIND TRENDS WITH OCCASIONAL GUSTS DURING THE AFTERNOON HOURS DUE TO DAYTIME HEATING.
